3. Hostels Accommodation

4. Cafeteria Services

5. Uniforms

All students are supposed to buy or make their own uniforms. However, they should follow the requirements listed below:

a) FEMALES

- Two decent white gowns. It must be thirty centimeters (30 cm) or more below the knees
- Flat white/black shoes (open shoes or sandals are not allowed)
- Two white laboratory/clinical coats with long sleeves

b) MALES

- Two white shirts preferred with long sleeves
- Two pair of decent trousers- khaki colored (cotton materials). Jeans or tight/model trousers are strictly prohibited.
- Black or brown leather shoes (open shoes or sandal is not allowed)
- Two white laboratory/clinical coats with long sleeves

6. Health Insurance

All students who possess valid Health Insurance cards (e.g., NHIF, Strategies, Jubilee etc.) should come with them and show them during registration.

IMPORTANT: Those who were not subscribed to any insurance plan, should pay for NHIF students' package of 50,400/= per year during registration process.

7. Supplementary Examination Fee

For those students who failed the End of Semester Examination (either I or II) and allowed to sit for Supplementary Examination shall be required to pay 50,000/= for each Supplementary Examination.
